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The program is focused on training professional lawyers.

Students will acquire the necessary knowledge of law from high-class specialists. Memorandums signed by the University ensure the passage of internships, which is the best way to acquire practical skills.

1. Aim:

The aim of the Master's Degree Program in Law is to prepare a bachelor's degree specialist, master of law, for future successful professional development, equipped with relevant practical experience and with the competencies required for independent scientific research.

Accordingly, the Masters of Law degree program provides students with a profound and systematic knowledge in: private, criminal or public law and comparative law; National and foreign legal systems of the main features, the theory of law, institutions, material and procedural law, general legal principles and values, and to elaborate on the legislative changes, judicial practice and scientific innovations focus tracking, as well as the knowledge of the permanent renewal ability; Ability to effectively apply knowledge gained in the field of law and other skills necessary for specialization; Ability to independently solve legal problems in the field of law, as well as skills needed to assess, analyze, reason, argue, and resolve issues; Ability to defend justice, human rights, social and democratic values while practicing law; Ability to conduct independent research; Ability to contextually analyze legal-ethical values; Modern legal thinking skills.

2. Learning outcomes

Graduates of the Master of Law program are equipped with the following sectoral and general (transferable) competencies:

1. Demonstrates profound and systematic knowledge of private, criminal or public law, enabling the formation of a new vision of complex problem solving; Understands ways of resolving private, criminal and / or public law matters;

2. 2. Using methods of explanation, make a complex assessment of private-legal, criminal or public-legal problems and look for new, original ways of solving them. Able to conduct independent, private, criminal and / or public law, conducts research using the latest methods and approaches;
3. Analyzes changes in the context of new legislative, judicial practice or scientific approaches (including recent research) and can provide reasoned legal conclusions.
4. Discusses his / her legal conclusions and arguments with representatives of the academic and professional community and may submit them in writing and orally, in their native or foreign language.
5. 5. Able to independently determine his / her learning directions based on a synthesis of theoretical components and practical experience and has the ability to expand knowledge based on the latest methods through primary sources, scientific articles or forensic analysis.
6. Analyzes existing legal values to ensure a fair balance of the interests of the parties and, where appropriate, contributes to the formation of new values.

3. assessment system

Students in each component of the program are graded through a 100-point system that includes midterm assessment and final assessment. Within each course, the student completes the syllabus assignments, prepares a presentation, participates in discussions, and engages in all other activities necessary to achieve the goals of the course.

100 point distribution is given in the table below, besides , types of checking their knowledge includes presentation, and checking other types of information that are given in syllabus in details.

The final exam is compulsory in each course. The final exam is given to a student who has earned at least 20 points in the midterm assessment.

Bachelor's Thesis Evaluation is carried out in accordance with the instruction of Undergraduate Thesis performance, defense, and Evaluation Instructions.

Student's achievement is evaluated by 100 grade system

Students' grading system provides for:

- a) five types of positive evaluation:
 - a.a) (A) Excellent– 91-100 points;

- a.b) (B) Very good - 81- 90 points;
- a.c) (C) Good - 71 – 80 points;
- a.d) (D) Satisfactory - 61 – 70 points ;
- a.f) (E) Enough - 51 – 60 points;

The student's marks on the additional exam are not added to the scores on the final grade. Assessment for the additional exam is a final assessment and will be reflected in the final assessment of the course.

In the event of a score of 0-50 in the final grade, the student receives a score of F – 0.

4. Pre requisite for admitting at the program

Unified National Exams. Persons with Bachelor's degree have the right to study in the educational program. who successfully passed unified master's degree examination and internal university specialty and language exam. (B2 level).

An individual with international language certificate will be exempt from the language test.

One month before the start of the exam period, the internal university exam topics will be posted on the University website: www.sangu.edu.ge

Enrollment without Unified National Exams- is possible based on the rule approved by the Ministry and education of Georgia December 29, 2011 №224 / N, pursuant to the rule of admission of the entrants to the Bachelor's and Master's degree without passing unified national examination.

Mobility. Enrollment in the educational program is also possible through mobility, according to the Order of the Minister of Education and Science of Georgia of February 2, 2010 No. 10 / N "On the Transfer from Higher Education to another Higher Education Institution".

Internal mobility. Applicants will also be eligible for internal mobility. Internal mobility terms and procedures are set by the Rector of the University and are regularly posted on the University's website at www.sangu.edu.ge

5. instruction methods applied in the educational program

Appropriate teaching arrangements are used to achieve the goals of the educational program. Program components, with the required ratio, provide contact and independent working hours.

In order to achieve the goals of the curriculum, the teaching program uses a teaching and learning method. Each of them combines methods, relevant activities, taking into account the course objectives and the specifics of the topics to be discussed, which are specifically defined by the syllabuses of the respective courses, taking into account the course objectives and the competencies developed within the course. depends on the objectives and learning outcomes of the respective training component, which are described in detail in the syllabuses of the courses.
